Nurturing Skills Learner Fund


The Minister for Children, Equality, Disability, Integration and Youth, Roderic O'Gorman, T.D., has launched a pilot of a new Nurturing Skills Learner Fund (NSLF).

The NSLF aims to assist Early Years Educators to pursue early learning and care (ELC) qualifications that have been approved by the Qualifications Advisory Board (QAB) while continuing to work in the sector.

The pilot Nurturing Skills Learner Fund scheme will fund a number of learners to undertake QAB-approved and Early Childhood Care and Education degree programmes (at levels 7 or 8), lowering the overall cost to those studying while working in the sector.

In order for learner to avail of financial support through the NSLF, learners must be currently working in an ELC or SAC service that is in contract for DCEDIY's Core Funding programme.

How Online Learning Works

Learners can study from home through Chevron's Virtual Learning Environment and engage with weekly study resources at times that suit their own schedule.

There are weekly live webinars to further support learners' learning, providing opportunities for group discussion and collaboration, fostering peer-to-peer learning.

Learners will be required to attend an inhouse session at the start of each stage of the programme. Following the completion of each module learners will have developed and gathered the knowledge, understanding and weekly feedback to enable them to complete their final assessment.

Professional Practice Placement is a requirement at all 4 stages of this programme, with 35% of the programme allocated for placement.

Through research, reflection and professional practice placement learners will further develop their professional practice and emergence as ethical and transformative leaders.
